

National Coastal Resilience Fund - Community Driven Planning for Nature Based Solutions Project Update



Project Overview

Co-develop community driven plans in two coastal communities in the Bay Area to advance nature based solutions to sea level rise.

- 1. Fund CBOs ("Community Partners") to lead the development and implementation of engagement plans
- 2. Creation of Community Project Teams to develop relationships between local and regional stakeholders, and pilot partnership models between CBOs and local government and government agencies
- 3. Nature Based Solution trainings from San Francisco Estuary Institute, and other technical assistance provided by BCDC, Coastal Quest and BayCAN



Selection Process & Eligibility Criteria

Four Phase Process:

- 1. Development and application of *community* prioritization criteria to inform targeted outreach
- 2. Solicitation of Community Partners via Interest Form
- 3. Development and application of Community Partner selection criteria
- 4. Follow-up calls with finalists and Final Selection



Community Prioritization Criteria

The Project Team used a two-tiered screening approach for prioritizing communities:

Tier 1 - identify risk based on social, economic, and environmental factors. Sea level rise exposure Environmental burden Historical marginalization Socioeconomic vulnerability

Tier 2 - identify communities that are ready to participate. Overall Coastal Resilience Siting score Active CBO BayCAN participation Existing Vulnerability Assessment



Interest Form

- 1. Sent out via BayCAN, Coastal Quest, Climate Resilient Communities, and San Francisco Estuary Institute
- 2. Collect basic organizational info and ten short answer questions
- 3. Did not require SOW or budget



Community Partner Eligibility Criteria

- 1. Community they serve is in one of the 9 Bay Area counties.
- 2. Community they serve faces significant environmental, pollution, or climate change induced burdens.
- 3. Community they serve lies adjacent to the Bay Shore and has projected sea level rise exposure or is currently impacted by sea level rise.
- 4. CBO has capacity/interest to perform the work of this project.



Community Partner Selection

- Received interest forms from 15 organizations
- Project Team selected four finalists scheduled "interviews"
- Final CBO selection:
 - Does the organization have a Nature Based Project in mind they would like to engage the community around?
 - Is the applicant representing a community that scored in the top 5 in "RISK" based on community selection criteria?
 - Is the CBO or their jurisdiction representing the community a BayCAN member?
 - Is this investment timely? Will provision of these funds at this specific time catalyze this project toward the next phase of project development or implementation?
 - Could this project be advanced to the point where it is eligible for Round 2 implementation funding during the project term?

Selected Community Partners

Ninth Root Alameda County

Connects people to marshes and shorelines through restored, culturally relevant, climate adaptive, spiritual and mental wellness oriented sanctuaries that create thriving habitats for wildlife, and resilient, healing, re-connective space for people.

RCC Proposal Overview

What: The SGC's Regional Climate Collaboratives (RCC) program "is a **capacity-building** grant program which enables cross-sectoral partners to deepen relationships and strengthen local coordination, leadership, knowledge, skills, and access to critical resources to drive and sustain climate action."

Who: BayCAN has applied with a proposal titled **Bay Area Climate Adaptation Network CBO Member Led Working Group.** Climate Resilient Communities (CRC) is the managing partner on the proposal.

Why: Many of you have requested BayCAN leverage this opportunity to support CBO members and build capacity through peer learning and technical assistance



RCC Proposal Draft Vision Statement

We envision a **self-led** working group of **community based organizations**, supported by the Bay Area Climate Adaptation Network, that **provides a onboarding and collaboration space** to CBOs interested in working on climate resilience, particularly those who may have not historically worked on climate issues or are in historically underserved communities, and provides capacity-constrained CBOs with the **tools** and **resources** they need to **lead** and **receive technical assistance** on climate resilience at the local and regional level.

We envision a self-led organization of CBOs that celebrate their expertise, work collectively and collaboratively, and act urgently to address the climate crisis and its health consequences in frontline communities.



RCC Proposal Core Scope of Work & Activities

BayCAN has requested **\$935,000** to implement the following:

- CBO-led technical assistance program that includes a wide array of training topics.
- Connection to funders and relationship building with agencies that will support & partner on projects.
- Building the capacity of CBOs to engage in and inform regional planning processes.
- Bringing CBOs not traditionally involved in climate work into the space.
- Engaging under-resourced communities & assessing community needs.
- Creating multi-benefit community and project plans that can be implemented.
- Applying to funding opportunities that will support implementation work.
